

JUNIOR CAMP FINAL REPORT - 1958

Part A.

Introduction: Junior Camp's second year was even more successful than the first year. With all housing, feeding, and program facilities ready before camp opened, the Camp started functioning as a complete unit in every way from the first day. Improvements and additions to the plant during the off-season added much to the living as well as program equipment, and a number of permanent improvements and new facilities were added during the season. As a whole the Junior Camp has shown a healthy and rapid growth during its two seasons of operation.

Part B.

Administration:

1. Food Services: Second year of excellent cooking by Lee and Mary Singleton. Average (or below) dining hall staff, showed little initiative and needed pushing and checking on most of the time to do even routine duties about kitchen and dining hall. Would have picked one responsible to supervise others, but found none early enough who seemed to be able to take initiative and responsibility. Found evidence that some smoking was going on in their quarters. Kitchen inventory attached as Annex B 1.

2. Health: Gratifying improvement over last year. 6 accidents, 6 illnesses, (12 insurance cases). and 30 infirmity-days out of 95 boys and 23 staff members. No boys left Camp with unhealed (or improperly attended) infected sores on legs, faces, arms or bodies. Inventory attached as Annex B 2. Supplies and equipment needed for next year attached as Annex C 2. Linen list attached inside linen cabinet door. Complete infirmity reports left in notebook second shelf, upper cabinet, first aid room.

3. Buildings and Equipment: Well suited and adequate to support full camp program for twelve units of sixty boys only. All additions and improvements this year based on camp remaining at that enrollment. Inventories attached as Annex B 1-4. Construction, repairs, supplies, and equipment needed for next year attached as annex C 1-5.

4. Staff: Exceptional group of men, even surpassing last year's. Excellent and superior performance both in program and cabin from all counselors. Congenial group and morale high. Special commendation is due Sonny Hallford for his efficient and conscientious handling of his duties as Head Counselor and directing the Junior Camp during absences of the Director.

Part C.

Program: See Daily Schedule, Typical week--Junior Camp, and Hobaches, Jr. File attached as Annex A.

1. Archery:

- a. Full CAA Program
- b. 2 Archery Contests well-conducted and with almost 100% participation.
- c. Good program with almost every camper receiving some award or awards in the CAA individual award system.
- d. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 a. Equipment needed attached as Annex C 5.

2. Crafts:

- a. Superior program with two Crafts' Exhibits and Puppet show for three performances.
- b. General assistance in many other programs such as circus, stunt nights, wild west day, candle holders, and cabin placques, etc. Every boy and counselor made own candle for final banquet. Copper enameling was successful addition to program.
- c. Last five-week program was somewhat handicapped by out-of-camp activities, but the quality of work done was superior although the quantity was not as great as first five-weeks.
- d. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 b. Equipment and supplies needed attached as Annex C 5.

3. Lakefront Activities:

- a. Program greatly improved this year through emphasis on individual instruction and records kept on individual achievement. (See personnel file of each camper.)
- b. Canoeing instruction to all campers going on two canoe trips.

4. Nature Lore:

- a. Nature den facilities built up during this season as a result of and to support a more active outdoor nature program. Charlie Hunt was responsible for this improvement. Both counselors carried on an active and well-organized program, a much improved program over last year.
- b. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 c.

5. Sports and Games:

- a. Very active program in small games (tetherball- one added, box hockey, horseshoes, chinning, ropes - added), softball, rag-tag football, tennis, badminton and sticks. Wrestling instruction given, and some tumbling.

- b. Several field days, organized game periods, and two tournaments were conducted.
- c. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 d.

6. Woodcraft:

- a. Excellent program conducted by Pete Austin with increased emphasis on cabin cook-outs and overnight camping trips. A cook-out of some type was conducted at least once each week and each boy had opportunity to spend from one to three nights out during first five-weeks, and from one to four nights out during second five-weeks.
- b. Junior Camp Council Ring was completed, a worthy contribution to the camp by this group.
- c. Equipment checked out from Houghton was usually in very poor condition. See Recommendations and suggestions for next year Part D.
- d. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 e. Equipment needed attached as Annex C 5.

7. Horseback:

- a. Horseback classes rode three times each week, one hour each time. They were graded by ability, and practically every ride missed was made up. Attendance book was turned in to office, ALONG WITH SPECIAL REPORT.
- b. Two riding exhibits, one at end of each five week period.

8. Evening Programs and Special Programs: (See Hobachee File-Annex A)

- a. Generally 1 night each week for the following: council ring program, cabin night, games night, cook-out, free night, special program and "friendship Council.
- b. Special Features: Puppet show, Circus, Wild West Day, Vanderbilt Estate Trip (2), "Unto These Hills" Pageant trip (2), Rotative Games Program, 4th of July Celebration, Birthday Party, OSC Induction (2), Craftsmen's Fair (between periods), Cabin Dramatique (2), Uncle Mike's Talks (Indian Lore and Nature Lore) (3), and certain special programs with Senior Camp; Indian Grand Councils (3), Woodcraft G. and Council (1), Opening Ceremonial, Atomic Energy Demonstration (2), Panhandle Pete Show, and Music Festival.
- c. Cooperated with Henry Hart in Tsali Counselor Training Program during first five weeks. From standpoint of Junior Camp it was felt that this was a very worthwhile program.
- d. Sunday Services and Friendship Councils: Both services each Sunday, as well as Morning Watch and Cabin Devotions, were worthwhile and contributed much to the summer's experience.

Sonny Hallford was responsible for directing Friendship Council and Pete Austin the morning service.

9. General.

- a. Archery, Crafts, Lake, Nature, Sports, and Woodcraft were required activities for three periods each day during week days, each camper repeating a single activity every other day. On Saturday a camper could choose the activity he wished to attend.

Part D.

Suggestions and Recommendations for next year:

1. Personnel:

- a. Maintain 60 boy capacity.
- b. Check with Junior Camp Director before next catalogue printing for some minor adjustments in clothing list for Junior Camp.

2. Kitchen and Dining Hall:

- a. One responsible dining hall staff member with slightly higher salary to supervise that staff.

3. Program:

- a. State in literature that rifle-marksmanship is not a Junior Camp activity, and rifles should not be brought to Camp.
- b. Due to poor condition of equipment as it is kept in Houghton Cabin, Junior Camp should have own cabin cook-out equipment. (See supplies and equipment needed for next year Annex C 5.)

4. General:

- a. Better means of communication between Senior and Junior Camp offices.
- b. Study should be made to get a distinctive name for the Camp rather than "junior" camp. To many boys and parents the present name connotes a camp on too primary a level, or just for very young children.
- c. Refer to Construction repair and equipment needed for next year (Annex C 1-5).

SUBJECT: Final Report, Junior Camp Riding Program, 1958

TO : M. A. McNamee, Jr., Head of Riding, Junior Camp

FROM : "Doc" Hollandsworth, Director, Junior Camp

1. In my opinion, the riding program for the 1958 season has been a notable success. With two exceptions, William Johnson (1-5) and Robert Kirkland (2-5), all participants in the program have made significant progress in their ability to ride. Without exception, each boy took part in the riding activities to a degree to fully justify the extra expenditure by his parents.

2. I strongly recommend that another source of horses be found for the Junior Camp riding program; i.e., horses that are better trained for elementary equestrian instruction. Since the horses were, I feel, unsuitable for young boys, a possible source would be a school or riding academy that has a good riding course in the winter and desires to send their animals to a camp in the summer. If I should find such a school, I shall try to establish contact between it and Camp employment.

3. I further believe that, in order to better equip those boys who are able to more efficiently meet the demands of our Society, the more advanced riders in the Junior Camp riding program should be permitted to show in the recognized horse shows in the Asheville area. In so doing, I feel that the boys would be able, to a great degree, to broaden their scope of experience by learning what is required of an individual to exhibit his ability in public. Some of our boys, particularly Steve Defrost, Tommy Rescove, Paul Ingle, Tommy Therr, and Bill Chouse, are fully prepared to demonstrate their equestrian ability in the formal show ring. I honestly believe that such boys as these would greatly benefit by showing in that they would gain a great deal of poise, patience, and confidence through their formal association with other children of their age. The educational value of doing this would be great to the boy.

4. As for physical improvements or alterations, I feel the stables and riding ring should be whitewashed. This would tremendously improve their appearance, and would also protect the wood.

5. There were 300 pounds of feed and three pasture-sized salt blocks remaining at the end of the season. All hay and straw were utilized.
