

JUNIOR CAMP FINAL REPORT - 1959

Part A.

Introduction: Junior Camp continued its steady growth with refinements and improvements in most all phases of camp administration and program. The third year of the camp was a successful one, and added much to consolidating the procedures and efforts of the first two seasons.

Part B.

Administration:

1. Food Services: Excellent both in preparation of food by Sue Berry, and Sara Hunsucker, and operation of kitchen and dining hall by the staff, Don Caldwell, David Bradley, Gordon Baker and Donnie Cochran. An improvement over last year in cooking, and far better cooperation and use of initiative by dining hall staff. All four boys entered camp life much better and were helpful not only in their assigned duties but also in all phases of camp activity. A superior group in character, attitude, and performance of their job. No evidence of smoking in this group. Kitchen inventory attached as Annex B1.

2. Health: No serious accidents or illnesses. Two cases of measles. No boys left camp with unhealed (or improperly attended) infected sores on legs, faces, arms, or bodies. Mrs. Estelle Speight did an excellent job as nurse. She was especially watchful and conscientious in watching after the health needs of campers and counselors. Infirmary inventory attached as Annex B 2. Supplies and equipment needed for next year attached as Annex C 2. Linen list attached inside linen cabinet door.

3. Buildings and Equipment: Well suited and adequate to support full camp program for twelve units of sixty boys only. All additions and improvements this year based on camp remaining at that enrollment. Inventories attached as Annex B 1-4. Construction, repairs, supplies, and equipment needed for next year attached as annex C 1-5.

4. Staff: Seems to improve each year. Excellent to superior performance in cabin and program duties by all counselors. Congenial group with apparent high morale. Sonny Hallford continued his efficient handling of duties as Head Counselor. He was completely competent in his direction of Junior Camp in absence of the Director and was an invaluable assistant to the Director at all times.

Part C.

Program: See Daily Schedule, Typical week - Junior Camp, and Hobachee, Jr. File attached as Annex A.

1. Archery:

- a. Full CAA Program
- b. Two Archery Contest well-conducted and with almost 100% participation.
- c. Better program than past two years with almost every camper receiving some award or awards in the CAA individual award system.
- d. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 a. Equipment needed attached as Annex C 5.

2. Crafts:

- a. Superior program with two Crafts' Exhibits. More work displayed in final exhibit than in any past exhibits.
- b. General assistance to other programs such as Olympics, Cabin Dramatiques, candle holders, cabin plaques, etc. Counselor craft periods after taps were well attended and appreciated.
- c. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 b. Equipment and supplies needed attached as Annex C 5.

3. Lakefront Activities:

- a. Staff continued excellent program of last year with good instruction and accurate records kept on participation and progress of each individual camper. These individual swimming records are filed in personnel folder of each camper.
- b. Canoeing instruction to all campers going on two canoe trips.

4. Nature Lore:

- a. Program continued under Charlie Hunt about same as last year. Addition of Jimmy Hollandsworth, although still a paying camper, helped in keeping the program going when it might have been closed when Charlie was absent on leave or cook-outs. Instruction has been good and much interest and progress shown by some boys.
- b. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 c.
- c. Equipment needed for next year attached as Annex C 5.

5. Sports and Games:

- a. Very active program in all games - tetherball, box hockey, kickball, softball, sticks, soccer (first five), badminton, and tennis. Lesser degree in horseshoes and football. Instruction given in wrestling, tumbling, and tennis.
- b. Several field days, organized game periods, and two tournaments were conducted.
- c. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 d.

6. Woodcraft: (Hiking and Cook-outs)

- a. Superior program conducted under leadership of Pete Austin, assisted by Billy Wood. More emphasis on overnight cook-outs and one three-day trip each five week period for boys most interested in camping out. About half of camp went on each three-day trip to "Waterfall Creek. Cook-out of some sort was conducted at least once each week and each boy had the opportunity of spending two to six nights out during each five week period. Two successful corn roasts were conducted by this group.
- b. Equipment checked out from Houghton Cabin was usually in very poor condition. See recommendations and suggestions for next year Part D.
- c. Inventory attached as Annex B 4 e. Equipment needed attached as Annex C 5.

7. Horseback:

- a. Instruction was only average or less during first five weeks, but changed to superior with Fritz Aberle's return for the second five weeks.
- b. Horseback classes rode three times each week, one hour per ride. Classes were graded by ability and practically every ride missed was made up. Attendance book was turned in to office and special record of attendance during the second five weeks is attached as Annex D.

8. Evening Programs and Special Programs: (See Hobachee File - Annex A)

- a. Generally one night each week for the following: council ring program, cabin night, games night, cook-out, free night, special program and Friendship Council.
- b. Special Features: Olympics, Vanderbilt Estate Trip (2), "Unto These Hills" Pageant trip (2), Rotative Games Program, 4th of July Celebration, Birthday Party, OSC Induction (22) Cabin Dramatique (2), Uncle Mike's Talk (Nature Lore), Horseback Slide Show, Fotomemories (slide show), Craggy Picnic and Hike, and Bald Knob All-day Hike. Certain special programs with Senior Camp: Indian Grand Councils (2), Woodcraft Grand Council (1), Opening Ceremonial, Atomic Energy Demonstration (2), "South Pacific", and Beowulf Water Pageant.
- c. Cooperated with Henry Hart in Tsali Counselor Training Program during first five weeks. From standpoint of Junior Camp it was felt that this was a very worthwhile program.

- d. Sunday Services and Friendship Councils: Both services each Sunday, as well as Morning Watch and Cab in Devotions, were worthwhile and contributed much to the summer's experience. A Counselors Sextet provided music at almost every Sunday Service. Sonny Hallford was responsible for directing Friendship Council and Pete Austin the Morning Service.

9. General:

- a. Archery, Crafts, Lake, Nature, Sports, and Woodcraft were required activities for three periods each day during week days, each camper repeating a single activity every other day. On Saturday a camper could choose the activity he wished to attend.

Part D.

Suggestions and Recommendations for Next Year:

1. Personnel:

- a. Maintain 60 boy capacity.
b. Check with Junior Camp Director before next catalogue printing for some minor adjustments in clothing list for Junior Camp.

2. Kitchen and Dining Hall:

- a. One responsible dining hall staff member with slightly higher salary to supervise the staff.
This was done this year, but the person selected should have been better oriented.

3. Program:

- a. State in literature that rifle-marksanship is not a Junior Camp activity, and rifles should not be permitted in Jr. Camp.
b. Due to poor condition of equipment as it is kept in Houghton Cabin, Junior Camp should have more of its own cabin cook-out equipment. (See supplies and equipment needed for next year Annex C 5.)

4. General:

- a. Refer to Construction repair and equipment needed for next year. (Annex C 1-5).

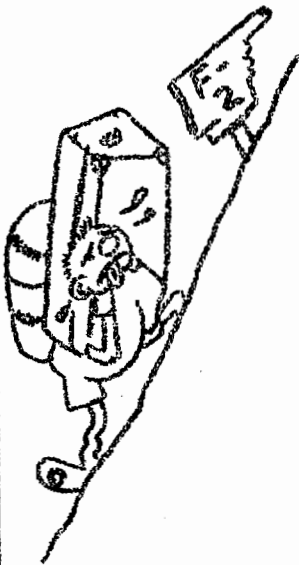

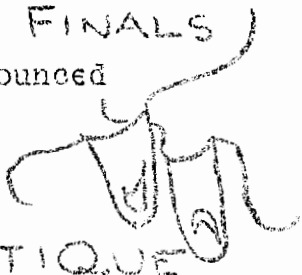
